Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

1. Read John 4:1-42 in light of the following statement, “Desire’s Deadly Delusion is that infinite needs can be satisfied by finite things.”
 - What sorts of infinite needs can you see in the woman?
 - In Jesus’ disciples?
 - How were they trying to satisfy those needs?
2. Read Jeremiah 2:13. Consider this list of “broken cisterns.” Which of them applies to you and what kind of infinite need does it point to in you?
 - Gossip
 - Food
 - Beauty
 - Busyness
 - Pornography
 - Alcohol/drugs
 - Purchasing
 - Noise
3. What would it look like, in practice, for you to exchange one of your “broken cisterns” for:
 - Acceptance of God’s love and His plan for you?
 - The wonder of God’s calling in your life?
